Title: Transforming the Future of Early Childhood Education in the Context of the UAE:

HCT Competency-based Pre-service Teacher Education Model

Session Description: Following the UAE government strategy on developing the early childhood sector so it aligns with UAE 2071 centennial plan, a number of government entities have been established to support the national drive for recalibrating early childhood education in the country. Inspired by this national plan, the Early Childhood Education (ECE) program at the Higher Colleges of Technology (HCT) has engaged in revamping the program so it contributes to preparing pre-service teachers for the early childhood stage who are equipped with 21st century competencies guided by principles of the national identity, innovation, entrepreneurship, and sustainability. With reference to UAE ECE teacher standards and the National Association for the Education of Young Children (NAYEC) standards, the program has developed a competency-based framework that embraces a holistic approach to child education capable of promoting ECE teachers who would support the national goal of discovering and nurturing talents at an early stage. The presentation will outline the main characteristics of the framework and the mechanisms that support its implementation.

Title: Incorporating Play-Based Learning: Workshop

Abstract:

Research has shown that play has multiple benefits for the development of young children. Despite this, much early-years teaching is still heavily teacher-led. In this presentation, we will look at the conversation around play-based learning (PBL) and talk about how to effectively incorporate PBL into the classroom, finding the balance between children's natural aptitude for play and the need for teacher-led instruction.
